

The Special Meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. Present were Trustees David Sambor, Ray Schulte, Martha Catherwood, Fiscal Officer Colleen Swedyk, 2 reporters and 24 residents. Martha Catherwood stated the public hearing was to further discuss the Brookside project and to address the proposal submitted by the Brookside residents. The trustees have received comments from the engineer's office and multiple reasons were listed as to why the island was not included. The plan is to incorporate the existing sign and landscape the side right-of-ways. The township will attempt to use existing plant materials. The former board had voted on the current plan. As a courtesy to David Sambor, the Board will be polled again at the regular meeting on this issue.

Howard Lowenthal submitted a letter from Robert Hass stating that he does not want any trees removed from his property for this project. Paul McDonough, Joyce Gardini, Dave Deets, Paul Rossman, Diane Valasz, Howard Lowenthal, Frank Kachurchik, Jim Gardini, and Geri Powell, asked clarifying questions about the project. The overall sentiment of the residents is to replace the island after the roadwork is completed. Martha Catherwood stated that the engineers have given us their recommendation and the Board would like to maximize this grant. David Sambor stated that he felt the project should be bid out two ways and a decision could be made after both bids are received.
